Exposure in China

International Student Network

Global Affairs, Innovative Thinking

Multimedia Production and Storytelling: The Tale of Two Cities – Journalism and Media Studies Centre

A hands-on skills-based programme that encompasses writing, photography, videography, basic editing and personal website development, this course will teach multimedia storytelling. Students will undertake a cultural exploration of Hong Kong and Shanghai and create their own portfolio of work.

Global Business in Asia: New Horizons – Faculty of Business and Finance

"Global Business in Asia: New Horizons" lasts for four weeks with the first two in Hong Kong and the last two in Shanghai. Mornings are devoted to lectures and discussions while the afternoons are reserved for guest speeches, site visits and group projects. Students will gain a deep understanding of the business and economic environment of the fastest-growing economy in the world and build close contact with scholars and senior managers of major companies operating in China. There will also be lots of cultural exchange given the diversity of the participants.

Multimedia Production and Storytelling: **Reporting the Two Koreas**

"Multimedia Production and Storytelling: Reporting the Two Koreas" is a handson, skills-based programme that introduces students to media coverage in both South Korea and North Korea. Students will acquire the basics of multimedia storytelling and analyse the North Korean media by examining information from North Korean defectors and refugees, and the key issues facing the divided peninsula. Through a one-week reporting trip to South Korea, students will realize classroom knowledge through meetings with journalists and government officials in South Korea.

Learn, Live and Intern in China

LLIC consists of a 2-week course at HKU offered by the Faculty of Business and Economics, followed by a 7-week internship in Hong Kong or Shanghai. Participants will be able to learn and work alongside HKU students and other participants from top-tier universities.

In addition to studying the programme, students will spend additional time in Shanghai, Beijing or the University of Cambridge undertaking a residential course.

- 1. Entrepreneurship, Creativity and Innovation
- Centre for Entrepreneurial Learning, The University of Cambridge The one-week course in the University of Cambridge is an integral part of HKU's programme. After studying for two weeks at HKU, students will be given the opportunity to learn how to develop entrepreneurial skills, **UNIVERSITY OF** stimulate creative thinking and nurture innovation to enhance business development. Students will experience the college culture of the University of Cambridge and enjoy the scholastic atmosphere of the city of Cambridge.

2. International Business Management in Shanghai or Beijing The two-week course in Shanghai or Beijing is an integral part of HKU's programme. Through a series of lectures and visits to multi-national corporations, students will actively participate in discussion on critical global issues and financial development. Professors of Mainland Chinese universities will also share their insights on China Studies with the participants.

Creativity in Practice: Branding Management and Training in the Creative Industries – Faculty of Arts

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This course enables students to better understand the relationship between creativity and commerce through the examination of various branding, management and talent training practices in the creative industries. It provides students with the opportunity to interact with practitioners across

Global and Cultural Studies (with English enhancement components)

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Students will learn about key issues in global affairs through a series of lectures and seminars dealing with world business, culture and Asia. Workshops will be focused on enhancing their English speaking and writing skills of the students.

Contemporary China

Hong Kong stands as a bridge between China and the world. With a long history of intellectual engagement with the Mainland, Hong Kong has unparalleled access to scholars and resources in the field of Greater China studies. Through a series of lectures and activities, participants will learn about contemporary China's development and Chinese culture.

Effective English Summer Series (Experience HK & Oxford)

The series consists of three components:

Part A: a 2-week programme - Faculty of Arts, the University of Hong Kong

Course 1: English Discussion Skills: Critical Discussions on China &

Course 2: English for Effective Communication: Business Simulations and Negotiation

These advanced speaking skills courses provide students with the opportunity to enhance their competency in the English language at a tertiary level while experiencing the unique multicultural environment of the University of Hong Kong. In addition to taking two credit-bearing courses, students will be invited to participate in a range of social activities through which they will discover one of Asia's most exciting cities.

Part B: a 1 week programme - Hertford College, the University of Oxford

The one-week programme at Hertford College, part of the University of Oxford is an integral part of the HKU programme. After studying for two weeks at HKU, students will be given the opportunity to demonstrate hands-on practice in the UK. Presentation skills and English writing skills will be enhanced through immersion in British culture. Students will experience the college culture of the University of Oxford and enjoy the scholastic atmosphere of the city of Oxford.

Introduction to Language and Linguistics – Faculty of Arts

This course will enable students to better understand the complexities and nature of human language and how we try to analyze its different areas. It provides a lively and interesting examination of the language that we use everyday and encourages students to explore various aspects of their own and other

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Chinese as a Foreign Language Series – Faculty of Arts

This series of intensive courses offers instruction in Putonghua at three different levels. Level I is for students with no prior knowledge of the Chinese language; Level II is for foreign learners who are able to recognize approximately 400 Chinese characters and write 250 Chinese characters; and Level III is for foreign learners who are able to recognize up to 1300 characters and write more than 900 of these characters.

English Strategies for Confident Conversations and Presentations – Faculty of Arts

This course aims to develop students' oral and presentation skills in both informal and formal social contexts such as meeting new friends and interacting at social gatherings. Areas covered include language and communication strategies,

Architectural Knowledge, Scientific Practice

Laboratory Exchange for Undergraduate and Research Postgraduate Students – Graduate School

The goal of this series is to provide Mainland students with the opportunity to pursue research projects with world-class scientists of HKU on ground-breaking topics. Candidates will conduct research work under the supervision of at least one member of the University's professoriate/research staff. Research areas cover issues on engineering, medicine, chemistry, biology and physical chemistry.

Engineering the Climate Change – Faculty of Engineering

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This 5-day course introduces initiatives taken to provide solutions to problems caused by climate change. Students will work with state-of-the-art technology and acquire knowledge in the areas of climate change observatory, solar energy, wind energy, nuclear energy wave energy

Career Discovery in Architecture – Faculty of Architecture

This three-week programme is designed for students considering architecture as a future career. The objective is to introduce students to historical, theoretical, and practical aspects of architecture. The programme comprises a series of lectures, basic drawing workshop, architectural design studio, model making and guided field trips.

Career Discovery in Landscape Architecture - Faculty of Architecture

Catering for a growing interest in how ecology and the natural forces interact with the built environment, this programme aims to introduce how ecological parameters can be implemented in design strategies. Students will participate in workshops and lectures about sustainability, planting design, cultural landscape, and how ecological processes/operations inspire the design of landscape spaces.

Digital Practice: Hong Kong - Faculty of Architecture

Led by professors from the University of Hong Kong, as well as invited practitioners with expertise in practice of cutting edge digital techniques. The programme offers participants opportunities to experience applications of computational tools during different stages of an architectural project.

Non credit bearing

This course is open to secondary school students (Form 4 and above). Others who do not have prior academic training in architecture field maybe considered.

CRITICAL THINKING AND CREATIVITY

Innovation, Creative Power, Analytical Mind

Creative Writing – Faculty of Arts

Dentistry and Oral Health – Faculty of Dentistry

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

All applicants should submit their applications online at www.hku.hk/summer/application before the application deadline. An application should include:

- (a) photocopy of your HKID Card or passport (for non-HKID cardholder);
- (b) photocopies of certificates and academic transcripts as specified in the application form; if these are not in English, they must be accompanied by a translation in English;
- (c) photocopies of transcripts of proficiency in English, e.g. HKCEE/DSE certificate with English Language subject result or IELTS/TOFEL result slip, if English is not the applicant's first language;
- (d) Additional supporting document(s) as required by individual course(s), if applicable. Please do not send any original documents to the University by post. The University is not responsible for any documents lost in the post; and
- (e) <u>For Credit Bearing Courses</u>, applicant must submit proof of payment of HK\$350 application fee. <u>Application fee is non-refundable</u>.
